ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT
TO THE
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
COLUMBUS TENNIS PATRONS, INC.

The Articles of Incorporation of Columbus Tennis Patrons, Inc., are hereby amended.

I.

The name of the Corporation is Columbus Tennis Patrons, Inc.

II.

The Articles of Incorporation of Columbus Tennis Patrons, Inc. are hereby amended by changing the name of the Corporation from Columbus Tennis Patrons, Inc. to Columbus Regional Tennis Association, Inc., and by deleting paragraph 1 of said Articles of Incorporation in its entirety and inserting the following in lieu thereof:

"1.

The name of the Corporation is Columbus Regional Tennis Association, Inc."

III.

The foregoing Amendment was adopted by the board of directors of the Corporation on January 3, 1995.

IV.

The approval of members was not required, and the foregoing amendment was approved by a sufficient vote of the board of directors of the Corporation.

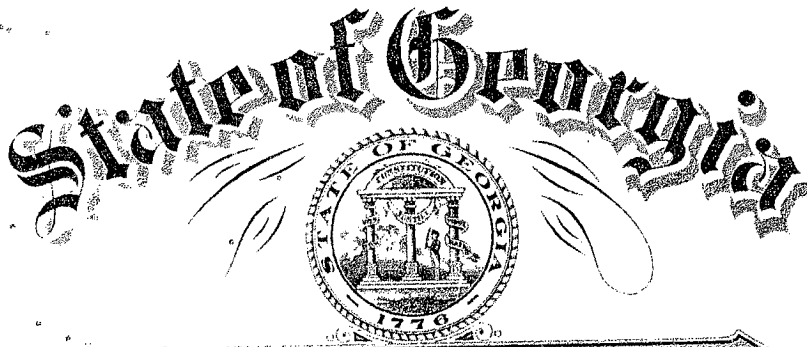

The petition of HENRY W. SWIFT, THOMAS P. HOLLOY, and
MRS. M. C. JENNINGS, respectfully shows that:

1.

Petitioners, their associates, successors and assigns,
desire to be chartered and incorporated under the name and style
of "COLUMBUS TENNIS PATRONS, INC."

2.

Petitioners show that said corporation is to be organized
and operated for charitable purposes, and not for pecuniary gain.

3.

Petitioners show that said corporation shall not issue
stock of any kind.

4.

The principal object and purpose of said charitable
corporation shall be to conduct tennis clinics for student players
in elementary and high schools, playgrounds and parks as well as
for the instructors of these student players; to sponsor tourna-
ments for senior and junior players; to provide special training
for boys eligible for Junior Davis Cup Squad and for girls
eligible for Junior Wightman Cup Squad; to provide travel assist-
ance for deserving top-ranking boys and girls to play in sectional
and national tournaments held outside of Columbus, Georgia; to
provide indoor winter play to improve youth for competition with
those having year-round facilities; to provide trophies and
other suitable awards for boys and girls distinguishing them-
selves in the game; and to do any and all things toward the
education and promotion of the game of tennis relative to the
general public.

5.

Petitioners desire the right to acquire property, both real and personal, by purchase, gift, devise, or bequest, and to hold and use the same for the purposes herein expressed; to sell or exchange, for investment or reinvestment, any property which it may acquire and hold for the purposes herein expressed; to select other persons to serve with them in the conduct of the business of said corporation; the right and authority to adopt such by-laws and rules, as they may deem fit and proper for the conduct of the business of said corporation; and further desire all the rights and privileges as given to such non-profit corporations as set forth in the Corporation Act of 1933 and all amendments thereto.

6.

The principal office of said corporation shall be located in Muscogee County, Georgia.

7.

Petitioners desire that said corporation shall be incorporated for a term of thirty-five years.

8.

The name selected for said corporation is not the name of any other corporation registered in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Georgia, as required by statute, as is shown by the certificate attached hereto.

9.

Petitioners are all residents of Muscogee County, Georgia, and their addresses are as follows: Mr. Henry W. Swift, 1890 Hilton Avenue, Columbus, Georgia; Mr. Thomas P. Holloy, c/o Field & Fireside, Columbus, Georgia; Mrs. M. C. Jennings, Green Island Hills, Columbus, Georgia.

WHEREFORE, petitioners pray that they be incorporated under the name and style of "Columbus Tennis Patrons, Inc.", and that said corporation shall have all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities herein prayed for, and shall have such other rights, powers and privileges as are now or may hereafter be granted to similar corporations.
