Matches are best $\mathbf{2}$ out of $\mathbf{3}$ short sets, first to $\mathbf{4}$ games with no ad-scoring. Third set is a Match Tie-Break - the first to $\mathbf{7}$ points.

No-ad scoring. The first player to win 4 points wins the game. If the score reaches 3 points all, the $7^{\text {th }}$ point becomes the game point. In singles, the receiver may choose to receive either in the ad or the deuce court. In doubles, the receiving team may choose to receive in either the ad or deuce court. In calling the score of a no-ad game, players may either use $1,2,3$ and game: or $15,30,40$, and game. They may call the score of 3 -all deuce. Be sure all players know how to play a tiebreak.

Match Tie-Break (first to $\mathbf{7}$ points): In lieu of a third set, a match tiebreak is to be played. The first to 7 points wins the $3^{\text {rd }}$ set. It does not have to be by 2. Format is the same as listed below for doubles and singles.

Service Order for ${ }^{\text {rd }}$ set: Next player/team in order will start service for the third set (first to 7 points tie-break). One player/team serves a point from the right side (deuce). They only serve one point. The next player/team in sequence serves two points, beginning on the left (ad) court and then the right side (deuce) court. After this, each player/team shall serve alternately for two consecutive points until the end of the tie-break game. In singles and doubles change sides after a total of 6 points. Continue until someone gets to 7 points. (Does NOT have to be by 2 ).

One game point will be awarded to the winner of the $3^{\text {rd }}$ set tiebreak.

## Matches are best 2 out of 3 short sets, with no ad scoring; if the score reaches 3-3, play a 7 -point Tie-Break (win by 2 ). Third set is a Match Tie-Break - first to $\mathbf{1 0}$ points by 2.

No-ad scoring. The first player to win 4 points wins the game. If the score reaches 3 points all, the $7^{\text {th }}$ point becomes the game point. In singles, the receiver may choose to receive either in the ad or the deuce court. In doubles, the receiving team may choose to receive in either the ad or deuce court. In mixed doubles, the boy must receive serve from the boy and the girl must receive serve from the girls. In calling the score of a no-ad game, players may either use 1, 2, 3 and game: or $15,30,40$, and game. They may call the score of 3 all deuce. Be sure all players know how to play a tie-break.

Service Order for Tie-break: Next player/team in order will start service for the third set (first to 10 points tie-break). One player/team serves a point from the right side (deuce). They only serve one point. The next player/team in sequence serves two points beginning on the left (ad) court and then the right side (deuce) court. After this, each player/team in sequence serves two consecutive points until the end of the tie-break game. In singles and doubles, change sides after a total of 6 points. Continue until someone gets to 10 points. (Must win by 2 ).

One game point will be awarded to the winner of the $3^{\text {rd }}$ set tie-break.

Match Tie-Break (first to $\mathbf{1 0}$ by $\mathbf{2}$ points): In lieu of a third set, a match tie-break is to be played. A team must win by 2 points. Format is the same as listed above for doubles and singles.
